



The Summary of Benefits and Coverage (SBC) document will help you choose a health [plan](#). The SBC shows you how you and the [plan](#) would share the cost for covered health care services. **NOTE:** Information about the cost of this [plan](#) (called the [premium](#)) will be provided separately. Important Questions	Answers	Why This Matters:
What is the overall deductible ?	\$100 /single or \$300 /family for Network Providers . \$200 /single or \$400 /family for Non- Network Providers .	Deductible resets January 1. Generally, you must pay all of the costs from providers up to the deductible amount before this plan begins to pay. If you have other family members on the plan , each family member must meet their own individual deductible until the total amount of deductible expenses paid by all family members meets the overall family deductible .
Are there services covered before you meet your deductible ?	Yes. Preventive care , Primary Care visit, Specialist visit, and Vision exam for Network Providers .	This plan covers some items and services even if you haven't yet met the deductible amount. But a copayment or coinsurance may apply. For example, this plan covers certain preventive services without cost-sharing and before you meet your deductible . See a list of covered preventive services at https://www.healthcare.gov/coverage/preventive-care-benefits/ .
Are there other deductibles for specific services?	No.	You don't have to meet deductibles for specific services.
What is the out-of-pocket limit for this plan ?	\$1,000 /single or \$2,000 /family for Network Providers . \$2,000 /single or \$4,000 /family for Non- Network Providers . Prescription drugs have a separate limit of \$3,000 single / \$6,000 family Network & Non-Network combined.	The out-of-pocket limit is the most you could pay in a year for covered services. If you have other family members in this plan , they have to meet their own out-of-pocket limits until the overall family out-of-pocket limit has been met.
What is not included in the out-of-pocket limit ?	Services deemed not medically necessary by Medical Management and/or Anthem, Non- Network Transplant Services, Premiums , balance-billing charges, and health care this plan doesn't cover.	Even though you pay these expenses, they don't count toward the out-of-pocket limit .
Will you pay less if	Yes, Blue Card PPO. See	This plan uses a provider network . You will pay less if you use a provider in the plan's

Do you need a referral to see a specialist ?	No.	You can see the specialist you choose without a referral .

Does this plan provide Minimum Essential Coverage? Yes

If you don't have [Minimum Essential Coverage](#) for a month, you'll have to make a payment when you file your tax return unless you qualify for an exemption from the requirement that you have health coverage for that month.

Does this plan meet the Minimum Value Standards? Yes

If your [plan](#) doesn't meet the [Minimum Value Standards](#), you may be eligible for a [premium tax credit](#) to help you pay for a [plan](#) through the [Marketplace](#).
